21st Century Community Learning Centers (21st CCLC) Grant Awardees

The purpose of the 21st CCLC program is to establish or expand community learning centers that provide activities designed to complement the regular academic program of K-12 students as well as opportunities for academic enrichment. Authorized under Title IV, Part B, of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), as amended by the *No Child Left Behind Act of 2001* (NCLB), the program's specific purposes are to offer:

- (1) Assistance to students in meeting state and local student performance standards in core academic subjects and opportunities for academic enrichment, including tutorial services for students, particularly those in high poverty areas and low-performing schools.
- (2) A broad array of additional services, activities, and programs to students such as youth development, drug and violence prevention, counseling, art, music, technology, service-learning, character education, and physical education and wellness to reinforce and complement the regular academic program of participating students.
- (3) Opportunities for literacy training and related educational development for families of students served by community learning centers and to help working parents by providing a safe environment for students when school is not in session.
