What is OGES?

- OGES is a process that allows teachers to earn their gifted education specialist certification in grades PK-12.
- OGES professionals must know and understand gifted education theory as well as gifted students' needs.
 - ✓ This includes specialized knowledge that teachers need in order to understand and support student learning of gifted students.

• 31,720


Number of teachers, counselors and administrators with certification, special endorsement, and/or college degree in Gifted and Talented Education





An Equitable Process Study Independent External Observation

An independent External Evaluator observer (Dr. Kathleen McKean, Director, Oklahoma Technical Assistance Center) was present at the OGES Competency Setting Process to make sure the equitable process was in placed.

Her comments:

• I was very impressed with the process they used, the number of applicants they got, and the representativeness of the group (geographic and demographic). They did an especially good job of ensuring that very small schools were represented; it is one of the few committees I have seen that fully represented all kinds of Oklahoma schools (as well as higher ed, etc.).

An Equitable Process Study Independent External Observation

Comments, continued:

• The only area of weakness was that few (if any) racial minorities were represented on the committee – however, the SDE did not ask for that info, so they couldn't balance on that basis. One mitigating factor is that two of the committee members have a long history of advocating for greater attention to and inclusion of children who are members of racial/ethnic/cultural minorities in G/T education.

- 1. Valid teacher certificate;
- 2. The equivalent of two years of full-time teaching experience at an accredited school under a valid state issued teacher credential;
- 3. Successful completion of an OCTP approved program with a minimum 18 hours of coursework;

- 4. Application with the university's recommendation for OGES certification submitted to the Oklahoma State Department of Education;
- 5. Passing score on the Oklahoma Gifted Education Specialist (OGES) Certification Exam;
- 6. \$25 application fee to accompany the application to the Oklahoma State Department of Education;

7. Individuals who were licensed in Oklahoma prior to January 1, 2016, and have met items one and two above, will be excluded from the requirements of items three and four above and will be allowed to take the OGES certification assessment and apply for the area to be added to the teacher certification/standard;

8. Individuals who have received a Gifted/Talented endorsement and/or enrichment area on their teaching certificate may, prior to January 1, 2016, request that the endorsement be changed to an OGES certification if they have met items one and two above and pay the fee outlined in item six. They will be excluded from the requirements of items three, four and five above.

Important Notices

- The OGES certification cannot be substituted for required certifications in other areas.
- OGES certification is for grades PK-12.
