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Meal Counting & Claiming:

Requirement: Each type of meal service line as observed on the day of review must provide an accurate count.

Finding: When state agency staff arrived at Patrick Henry students were going through the serving line and no point of service was being taken. After breakfast was over the manager scanned student bar codes out of a notebook. At lunch students would go through the line giving the cafeteria manager their number to enter into the POS system. If the student(s) did not know their number she would tell them to go on without writing their name down or looking it up in the system. There was one student who came to the POS and asked to buy milk because she had brought her lunch. The manager told her to get a plate; the manager placed a piece of fruit on the plate and gave her milk. When asked why the student was given a plate with fruit when she just wanted milk, the manager stated she always gives the students a plate and milk when they bring their lunch if they come to buy a milk because she doesn't feel they bring a healthy lunch. Student account was charged for reimbursable meal according to Daily Purchase Report. Another student came into the cafeteria and did not go through the POS but a teacher got the student milk. The student never got a tray and was not charged for the carton of milk.

Finding: Clinton MS School students would go through the line at both meal services enter their number into the POS without taking any food items or taking just one item. When students were asked why they were entering their number without taking any food or one item, they said we are required to enter our number even though we are not eating. Some students would take food and walk directly to the trash can and throw the entire meal in the trash. At breakfast students were bringing in donuts from outside source and coming through the POS getting milk and or juice and entering their number into POS system. Some students would not take any items and enter their number in POS system. At lunch students would go through the POS with a meal and return back to the serving line to get additional items and give to their friends. Students were not charged for additional items.

Finding: At East Central JH the POS system would not charge adult breakfast meals. Students were not taking any items and entering their student ID number.

Finding: At Robertson ES a student was given a lunch and didn't want to eat. His number was entered in POS. I asked the District employee if he was sick and didn't want to eat; she stated I was told every student must a take meal.

Finding: Memorial HS students were getting meals and throwing them in trash without consuming any of the food items. Students indicated they were required to take a tray.

Corrective Action: Ensure point service is being taken and student understands they are not required to take a tray and or enter their student ID into the POS system if not eating.
