CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

State Superintendent Joy Hofmeister called the State Board of Education regular meeting to order at 1:04 p.m. and welcomed everyone to the meeting. Ms. Cheadle called the roll and ascertained there was a quorum.

Superintendent Hofmeister updated on the Fordham Institute recognition for hard work on the ESSA Plan-school accountability; Governor's Capitol Christmas Trees decorated by elementary students from 20 schools November 28 and a performance by Darcy Lynn Farmer, America's Got Talent winner.

Recognition of Department Employee for the Month of November

GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS

F719 State Department of Education Legislative Budget Request – Approved

Carolyn Thompson, Chief of Government Affairs, presented the FY19 legislative budget request for \$2,922,060.907 that includes a \$473million increase from FY18. Ms. Thompson reviewed budget concerns and appropriation needs for school districts, state aid; supervision of functions for General education, Special education and Administration.

Board members asked questions and discussed emergency/certified ratios, competitive teacher pay increase, distribution options; effective teacher identifiers/indicators; state formula auditing and terms.

Board members Baxter and Franks expressed concerns of the current state budget. Board members Flanagan expressed his concern about this current budget request and discounting of budget and agency if this request is presented.

Brad Clark, General Counsel, State Board of Education advised about statutory obligation of SDE/SBE to present a budget based on needs and not the current realistic climate of the state.

Focused Field of Study for a Pre-Engineering Academy at Canadian Valley Technology Center-Chickasha Campus Approved

The career technology center met all application requirements for math and science coursework programs.
