As such, Frog Street is committed to equity and accessibility across all of our products including our Teacher Portal. We maintain WCAG 2.1 and Section 508 compliance which fully meet the requirements of the Oklahoma Electronic and Information Technology Accessibility Act. Frog Street recently submitted a comprehensive VPAT accessibility conformance report to the Oklahoma State Textbook Committee. Public Comment: Publisher Response Statements from Bedford, Freeman & Worth Publishing Group LLC

1. Do the textbooks under consideration conform to the requirements of the Oklahoma Electronic and Information Technology Accessibility Act?

This statement is in regards to Macmillan Learning (legally known as Bedford, Freeman & Worth) submission for Oklahoma State's 2023 Math bid.

We have reviewed the standards outlined in Information and Communication Technology Accessibility Standards (V 2.0 effective in March 2020) and are currently in compliance with all areas except as outlined in our VPAT. We expect all outstanding issues to be complete by the end of the year. Our mission at Macmillan Learning is to inspire what's possible for every learner. That means no matter their demographics or abilities, we strive to provide learners with the best chance possible to succeed and flourish in their educational experience.

To start, Bedford, Freeman, and Worth/Macmillan Learning textbooks and course materials have been <u>Global Certified Accessible</u> by the not-for-profit Benetech since 2019 to provide "born accessible" e-books. This independent, third-party certification is renewed annually, and is based on compliance with the following guidelines:

- EPUB Accessibility 1.0 specification: established by the IDPF (International Digital Publishing Forum) and maintained by the W3C (World Wide Web Consortium)
- W3C's Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.0 AA as referenced in the Federal Section 508 Electronic and Information Technology Accessibility Standards (Refreshed 508 Standards)
- Accessibility metadata to promote conformance and discoverability of certified accessible publications

Macmillan Learning produces e-books in EPUB3 format. Our e-books include accessibility metadata, short and long alt text, clear structure and organization, and a variety of navigation methods including page and heading navigation. The e-books reflow and respond to magnification, so the text is readable at 400% magnification.

Since 2017, Macmillan has been providing alternative text for all images inside our e-books, slides, and other resources. Depending on the complexity of the image, we provide both short and extended descriptions. In the last two years we have begun to provide extended descriptions to all users rather than just screen reader users so that students with other print related disabilities, learning or cognitive related disabilities, or that simply prefer a written description to a chart or graph have access to extended description as a resource.



Our videos include closed captions, audio descriptions, and transcripts. Videos are hosted in a customized player that has been tested for compliance to WCAG 2.1 by an accessibility consulting agency that employs assistive technology users for testing.

We actively work with accessibility experts to ensure the best experience for all users in our learning simulations. Many of our interactive simulations provide a rich, enhanced learning experience for all students. Simulations are also tested by an accessibility consulting agency by assistive technology users.

Equivalent Facilitation

We recognize that compliance with accessibility standards is not the equivalent to usability. Because every student has a unique learning experience, we also offer, at no additional cost, all of our educational materials in alternative formats designed to meet students where they are most comfortable. Requests can be made to our accessibility team in advance of the class beginning or throughout the school year by contacting us directly at webaccessibility@macmillan.com. While fulfillment of request can vary depending on the complexity of the request, we aim to provide alternative formats within 5-10 business days of the request being received.

2. Have the designated textbooks been professionally tested under the Act and accompanied by an Accessibility Compliance Report?

Macmillan Learning partners with <u>Tech for All</u> to conduct third party testing with users with disabilities. Tech for All uses the following methods for testing:

- I. An accessibility expert conducts an overall technical analysis in order to identify issues of technical compliance that would affect mobility impaired, deaf/hearing impaired, and low vision users. The evaluator inspects each screen using Google Chrome with the Wave and aXe toolbars. Code analysis is conducted using browser Developer Tools.
- II. Keyboard accessibility analysis (for mobility and physically impaired users) is conducted by attempting to thoroughly navigate the website through the keyboard, without using a mouse, using Google Chrome and Safari browsers.
- III. For deaf and hard of hearing users, any audio content is assessed for proper captioning.
- IV. The accessibility for low vision users is evaluated three ways: (1) using the screen magnification, palette, and contrast controls provided by the operating systems; (2) using the font resizing capability offered by the browser, and (3) using Color Contrast Analyzer version 2.2.



V. An evaluator who is legally blind conducts the screen reader testing. The goal is to identify accessibility barriers that are likely to be experienced by users who are blind. The evaluator works through the website using the JAWS for Windows (v. 2021) screen reader with Google Chrome, and VoiceOver screen reader with Safari browser. Any pages found to have screen reader issues are re-examined in interactive sessions with a sighted evaluator.

Please accept this letter in response to two public comment questions for publishers.

- Do the textbooks under consideration conform to the requirements of the Oklahoma Electronic and Information Technology Accessibility Act? https://oklahoma.gov/omes/services/informationservices/is/policies-and-standards/accessibility-standards.html
 - Curriculum Associates meets this requirement. Our student bookshelf with eBook meets WCAG 2.0AA with documented exceptions. We are in the process of optimizing our Teacher Toolbox resources for WCAG Compliance to the greatest extent possible. It should be noted that Curriculum Associates provides NIMAC with NIMAS versions of the student textbook and student-facing, printable ancillaries for the procurement of accessible print versions.
- 2. Have the designated textbooks been professionally tested under the Act and accompanied by an Accessibility Compliance Report?
 - Curriculum Associates has an ACR for the student bookshelf with student eBooks, which has been
 professionally tested by our internal compliance team and reviewed by a third-party accessibility
 vendor. For the Toolbox, we are actively working on documenting our current compliance, but we
 do not currently have a finalized ACR for that area of the product, as that platform is not yet fully
 compliant. As noted above, we are in the process of optimizing Toolbox resources for WCAG
 compliance to the greatest extent possible, and this includes PDFs of the Teacher's editions (with
 documented exceptions).

In response to your request for information:

1. Do the textbooks under consideration conform to the requirements of the Oklahoma Electronic and Information Technology Accessibility Act?

At McGraw Hill, we are working to create universally accessible products available to all learners. To achieve this and continuously improve the accessibility of our products, our teams engage with external experts and communities of accessibility advocates. For example, we are deeply connected with the Book Industry Study Group and the Software & Information Industry Association to ensure the software and content we produce is accessible and usable by all learners.

We have included the current ACR for the Open Learning student platform on which the product is delivered. We are in the process of remediating both the teacher and student experience and expect to have a new ACR available in March 2024.

The known accessibility features of the Reveal Math content include:

- Built-in text-to-speech tools and screen reader compatibility for the eBook and most HTML-based resources.
- Closed captions and transcripts for video and audio materials.
- Alternate text for images
- Content does not rely exclusively on color to convey critical information.
- Compatible with screen magnification software to resize content.
- Compatible with word prediction and text-to-speech tools.
- Highlighters are provided in the four standard colors (yellow, rose, green, blue)
- All navigation elements and menu items have keyboard shortcuts.
- Meets all requirements for color contrast standards

We are committed to regularly updating our ACR's, inclusive of new content.

Additionally, McGraw Hill is compliant with the National Instructional Materials Accessibility Standard (NIMAS) and provides files of the core student content to NIMAC for use in developing alternate accessible formats. We are committed to working with all of our education partners to meet the needs of students and teachers. In the event that alternative formats for content are required, we will work with the district to evaluate the options and, wherever possible, provide the necessary content.

2. Have the designated textbooks been professionally tested under the Act and accompanied by an Accessibility Compliance Report?

We have included a current ACR for the Open Learning student platform on which the product is delivered. The Testing was completed with a professional, external accessibility testing vendor.

We use independent 3rd party vendors to create Voluntary Product Accessibility Template (VPAT) for our products as a measure of compliance with the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) version 2.0 AA. We have temporarily supplied VPATs for existing copyrights as part of the submission. Savvas will provide the Oklahoma c2025 VPATs to the Department of Education for review as soon as they are available.
