

District Adoption Timeline¹

Semester	Phase	Action	Checklist
Fall	Preparation	Establish the Process	 Define the parameters of adoption (e.g. budget, decision-making process, technology needs). Create a timeline and milestones from adoption to launch. Assemble the district adoption committee. It should include 3-9 members including a local community stakeholder, a chairperson who is a principal or curriculum specialist, and teachers of the subject currently considered for adoption.
		Develop the Lens	 Establish an instructional vision for the content area that explains what teaching and learning for the subject area should look like. Collect and analyze district data (e.g. student achievement, classroom observation, teacher experience).
Spring	Investigation	Know the Choices	 Identify available programs for the grade(s) and content area(s). Research existing evaluation(s) of programs to learn about alignment and other features of quality. Gather anecdotal information about programs from other districts and/or subject-matter experts. Narrow the selection to 2-4 material sets.
		Explore the Materials	 Review the completed rubrics for each state-approved program to determine how each address identified district priorities. Contact publishers and request samples and presentations. Determine professional learning needed for the implementation of each program.
	Adoption	Make a Decision	 Compare the strengths and gaps for each program. Analyze stakeholder feedback. Assess the implementation support needs for each program. Use the local committee process to make a final selection. Communicate decisions and next steps (e.g. ordering, distribution).
		Implement	 Create a learning plan that progresses from "getting to know" the materials to use them to teach. Establish a feedback system for responsive professional learning. Ensure time and site support for teachers using the adopted materials.
