

The Cambridge School Classics Project

The Cambridge School Classics Project (CSCP) was set up in 1966 under a joint initiative by the University of Cambridge Faculty of Classics and the UK government Department of Education, funded by the Schools Council and the Nuffield Foundation. The Project is now a department of the Faculty of Education of Cambridge University with a staff of eight headed by Director Caroline Bristow. CSCP is entirely self-funded, with the majority of its income coming from the *Cambridge Latin Course*. This means that every *Cambridge Latin Course* purchase directly funds classics educational research and development.

The aim of the Cambridge School Classics Project (CSCP) is to help make the classical world accessible to as many students as possible - whatever their age or background - by

- forging strong links with teachers and learners
- advancing the pedagogy of Classics teaching through research and development
- creating high quality, innovative teaching materials based on research and development
- exploiting new technologies to reach out to new audiences and create cutting-edge materials

CSCP is the only Nuffield project from the 1960s still running under its original constitution. Its role has expanded significantly since its inception though. With the *Cambridge Latin Course* now firmly established, there have been a number of new initiatives to support the teaching of Classics, including the provision of cross-curricular materials for children at all stages of education. Another major step forward was the formation of a North American Cambridge Classics Project that provides support and in-service training for colleagues in Canada and the USA.

CSCP continue to author the *Cambridge Latin Course* and all supporting materials, including development of digital activities and online content. All materials are created through research and development practices in line with CSCP's long history as a research project and making use of the latest language acquisition and educational theory.

The Cambridge Latin Course

Theoretical Basis

The University of Cambridge School Classics Project (CSCP) was developed in the 1960s in response to criticisms of traditional methods of Latin teaching and was revolutionary in its adoption of the latest research in language learning. Since then, the Project and the resulting course, the *Cambridge Latin Course*, have led the way in evidence-based teaching of Classical languages.

In contrast with the stimulus-response, drill-based teaching of behaviourists such as Skinner, the *Cambridge Latin Course* instead has adopted an approach based on the 'transformational' grammar of Chomsky (following Chomsky *Aspects of the Theory of Syntax* 1965) and the 'system/ structure' grammar of linguists such as Halliday (as detailed in Halliday *Introduction to Functional Grammar* 1985). Dr John B Wilkins, the early linguistic

consultant on the *Cambridge Latin Course*, adapted these theories in order to develop a course which aims to swiftly develop functional reading skills through the reading of continuous prose in order that students may be able to comprehend original Latin literature. He developed the concept of a 'passenger' grammar which would "migrate inside the material" and therefore required learning materials which would be built up "according to a carefully designed grammatical plan. Significant patterns are rehearsed to the point that habits are formed in the learner" (Wilkins *Teaching the Classical languages: towards a theory I* in *Didaskalos* 1969).

The overall objectives in creating a reading course were clear from the outset. As stated in the original Teacher's Handbook to the *Cambridge Latin Course*, "The course presents the language not as an end in itself, nor as an instrument of general mental training, but rather as the means of gaining access to a literature and the culture from which it springs." (CSCP *Teacher's Handbook to the 1st edition* 1971). In designing the reading course, it was also considered essential to present students with the intrinsic motivation of a well-written and engaging narrative: motivated students are more likely to engage with their learning (Gardener *Social psychology and second language learning: The role of attitudes and motivation* 1985). The narrative readings are placed in an authentic cultural context through the use of extensive paralinguistic material, including archaeological evidence and, in later stages, original text. This creates additional motivation through engagement with the ancient world and its culture, but it also enables students to better construe meaning as interactive readers of Latin.

Drawing on the acquisition-learning hypothesis (Krashen *Second Language Acquisition and Second Language learning* 1981), there is a clear distinction made between *learning about* a language and *skill in using* a language. Language features are encountered initially through reading before any analysis takes place. The overall progression of the *Cambridge Latin Course* is aligned with natural language acquisition, each Stage sequentially building competence. The rote learning of paradigms has been avoided and instead the focus is on the use of grammar within a meaningful sentence in order to achieve linguistic competence in reading and understanding of the specific material being studied. Translation processes are carefully met, developed, and then retrieved over a period of time in order to embed automaticity. Each Stage begins with the initial encounter with the new feature in a carefully constructed and illustrated sequence of sentences. The initial story then expands upon this, including examples of the new feature but embedded in extended text which is within the comprehension of the reader. At this point the new feature may be analysed and consolidated, and then the subsequent narrative increases in linguistic complexity across the Stage. This new feature will then recur regularly across subsequent Stages. By developing different reading strategies concurrently, students acquire proficiency more swiftly. The use of higher-level strategies such as inference (Goodman *Reading: a psycholinguistic guessing game* 1967), is underpinned by lower-level strategies (see the work of PB Gough and others) at a sentence, clause, phrase and word level, developed through extensive reading of the target language and also language exercises and discreet grammar and vocabulary work.

Course Materials

The Cambridge School Classics Project has continued to innovate in response to educational research and the needs of educators. The underlying course structure and its inductive

methods has proven effective and adaptive, responding well to the ever-changing educational environment. The *Cambridge Latin Course* is now a well-established reading course comprised of an internationally successful series of textbooks and ancillary resources.

The *Cambridge Latin Course* is comprised of four units of study, with each Unit containing between 8 and 14 chapters, or Stages. Each Stage contains highly structured yet engaging materials which guide the learners through inductive language acquisition, beginning with model sentences supported by images to guide translation and moving through a series of readings based around a continuous narrative. Language features are reinforced primarily through reading, although specific exercises and vocabulary lists are also provided. The cultural material focuses on the early Roman Empire, beginning in the town of Pompeii before taking in Roman Britain, Egypt, and Rome itself. This time period was chosen as one which has a significant quantity of material remains and extant authentic literature, and was also a time of diverse political and social interactions, giving scope to the study of both high culture and social history. The individuals chosen as the cast for the narrative, and the events in their lives, are based as far as possible upon historical evidence allowing students to quickly immerse themselves in authentic cultural studies.

The print materials have made use of developments in semiotics and dual coding in order to support language acquisition and cultural studies. Each Unit is fully integrated into a visual system: pages are laid out in a coherent, clear, and consistent manner with exercises subtly colour-coded for ease of identification. Each Unit is fully supported with images of relevant archaeological material which relates to the thematic content of the narrative. The stories themselves are illustrated with full-colour line drawings which have been chosen to depict key information from the story, scaffolding the narrative and providing a starting point for development of metacognitive reading skills. The multi-modal presentation of new linguistic features, using full-colour line drawings and supported by interactive online activities, enables the inductive learning of increasingly complex constructions in a logical and meaningful manner.

Extensive additional support is provided for teachers and learners, and a wide variety of resources and ancillary materials accompany this course. The Teachers' Manual suggests learning activities and offer support and guidance in delivering the material in line with the underlying pedagogy. The online materials available via Elevate include: digital textbooks; 'story explorers' which are customisable and interactive versions of the text providing differing levels of grammatical and vocabulary support; vocabulary testers; sorting activities for thematic and linguistic content; and online links to a wide variety of content on Roman life and history. There are further electronic resources available in the form of interactive content, audio of all the Latin, documentaries covering the main cultural topics of each Stage, and video dramatizations of many of the stories. In addition, there is an extensive range of ancillary printed materials including Teachers' Guides and Worksheet Packs. There are also audio and video materials for the first two books.


Oklahoma offers curriculum for some, but not all, World Language Other than English: the languages of French, German, Italian, Spanish.



The principles of Universal Design for Learning are incorporated in the design and development of the proposed solution.

Note that in 2024, Davvero will be migrating to our newest online digital online learning platform, The KWL Hub, which may will have slightly different functionalities and greater capabilities.




Exhibit 1-1: Accessibility Toggle




Exhibit 1-2: English and Spanish Versions of a QuaverHealth•PE Song
