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Comment: Oklahoma does not have an explanation for the SY 2022-2023 increase in the number of children exiting as no longer eligible for part C prior to reaching age three compared to the previous year. Oklahoma had an increase in referrals identifying as Hispanic in SY 2022-2023 as a result of public awareness activities targeting Hispanic communities over the past two years. The increased referrals has resulted in an increase in Hispanic children exiting. Oklahoma does not have an explanation for the SY 2022-2023 increase in the number of children exiting who are identified as Asian compared to the previous year.
